WHAT I WISH EVERY STUDENT UNDERSTOOD BEFORE LEAVING CAMPUS

The most fulfilled individuals I've met are not those who believed they knew everything, but those who remained interested in the world and the people around them.

Finally, I hope students leave campus knowing that their worth is not defined by titles, salaries, or how quickly they "settle." Life has seasons—some loud and successful, others quiet and reflective. Each has its place. Give yourself permission to grow at different speeds, to rest when needed, and to change your mind along the way.

As you step beyond these familiar spaces, remember that campus was never meant to give you all the answers. It was meant to prepare you to ask better questions. Wherever you go next, carry that with you—and trust that you are more prepared than you think.
